The 2019 challenge will feature quilts that evoke a visual representation of the songs we love from any genre, any time period. Whether you are a DANCING QUEEN, like DANCING ON THE CEILING, or dancing in your BLUE SUEDE SHOES, I HOPE YOU DANCE! Whether you are a DREAM WEAVER, enjoy ALL THAT JAZZ, WALKING ON SUNSHINE, SINGING IN THE RAIN and hearing GOOD VIBRATIONS, I hope you TWIST AND SHOUT with this challenge. Whether you are LEAVING ON A JET PLANE, let COUNTRY ROADS TAKE (YOU) HOME or are LOOKING FOR ADVENTURE across AMERICA THE BEAUTIFUL as KING (Queen) OF THE ROAD, I hope you gear up for this. Whether you desire to CLIMB EVERY MOUNTAIN, BUILD A CITY ON ROCK AND ROLL, travel SOMEWHERE OVER THE RAINBOW, or just like to feel yourself SLIP SLIDING AWAY to a PEACEFUL EASY FEELING as you DREAM ON, it will make me so HAPPY if you are IN THE MOOD to participate in this year's challenge.*

Remember: Nothing is *IMPOSSIBLE* and *ANYTHING GOES!* (okay, almost anything) *I'M A BELIEVER* and have immeasurable *RESPECT* for the talent in this guild; *NOBODY DOES IT BETTER!* So many of *YOU MAKE IT EASY* to create *SOMETHING WONDERFUL!* I also *BELIEVE* that *I AM A COCKEYED OPTIMIST* and have *HIGH HOPES*, but *WOULDN'T IT BE LOVERLY* if we had record participation for this year's challenge? *IT'S GOING TO TAKE SOME TIME*, but *OH, WHAT A FEELING! I know you will be *SATISFIED* and feel like you are *ON TOP OF THE WORLD!*

### DETAILS:

1. Sign up to enter the 2019 Quilt Challenge by the August 12, 2019 meeting.
2. Design and create a wall hanging as an interpretation of a favorite song, size not specified.
3. Quilts must have a label permanently attached to the back with the quilt maker's name as well as the artist's name and the song title which will also be the name of *THE QUILT*).
4. Quilts will judged on the basis of creative interpretation of song, skill and technique, use of color and embellishments, and overall guild favorite.

My *ANTICIPATION* is already mounting. *I CAN ONLY IMAGINE* the *WONDERFUL! WONDERFUL!* creations that will be displayed for our *CELEBRATION* in October. So... *DON'T GO BREAKING MY HEART; MAKE ME SMILE* and sign up this year's quilt challenge. All together *WE ARE A PATCHWORK QUILT* and each of us a *SHINING STAR* bound together by our guild. *LET'S DO IT!*
